### MRSA (Methicillin Resistant staphylococcus Aureus) SCREENING

**<u>PURPOSE</u>**: Compliance with New Jersey Act concerning the prevention of health care facility-acquired infections and supplementing Title 26.

#### **SUPPORTING DATA:**

#### **PROCEDURE:**

- 1. All patients being admitted to the ICU will be screened for MRSA.
- 2. Emergency Dept. Nursing will obtain the MRSA Screening nasal swab in the ED following the Standing Order for MRSA Screening form.
- 3. Patients to be screened for MRSA:
  - a. All admits from the ED to ICU
  - b. Direct admits to the ICU
  - c. Transfers to ICU from other units: on the admitting unit.
  - d. Transfers or discharges from ICU if they have been an inpatient for 72 hours or more.
- 4. The screening cultures will be done in accordance with HRMC laboratory policy for specimen collection of nacres cultures for MRSA SCREEN.
- 5. MRSA positive test results are a critical value and will be reported by St. Clare's laboratory by telephone to the patients unit. The RN receiving the communication must document the result.
- 6. Patients who test positive for MRSA will be placed on CONTACT PRECAUTIUONS in accordance with current IC policy.
- 7. Colonization or infection of the patient will be determined by the physician.
- 8. Decision to decolonize a positive colonized patient will be at the discretion of the attending physician. If the physician elects to decolonize they will be advised to follow the decolonization protocol set forth by the Infectious Disease physician in charge of Infection Control at HRMC.

Doxycycline 100mg PO BID	Rifampin 300mg PO BID
Bactroban nasally TID	Hibiclens wash daily

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- 1. If allergy doxycycline may be substituted with Bactram DS BID or Zyvox 600 mg BID.
- 2. If any questions or concerns physicians may contact I D services.

9. Patients who are treated for active infection of MRSA can be retested in accordance with IC policy IC 006.
