SCOPE

All members of the Cardiopulmonary Department

PURPOSE

To care for the patient and maintenance of a tracheostomy.

- Trach care is a joint responsibility between Respiratory Care and Nursing.
- Perform trach care once per shift, and whenever needed.
- Change trach ties whenever wet, soiled or insecure.
- Change pre-cut dressing whenever wet or soiled.

PROCEDURE

- Gather supplies
- Wash hands well
- Put on gloves
- Suction patient (if needed) (reference Cardiopulmonary Policy and Procedure Manual, section 3B, policy 17)
- Clean around trach with sterile water
- Change pre-cut dressing
- Change trach tie (collar) (have second person assist to hold trach in place in case patient coughs while changing trach collar)
- Change inner cannula, if needed.

Bedside supplies:

- -Always have the following supplies at the bedside and readily accessable when a patient has a trach:
 - Manual resuscitation bag and mask
 - Suction catheter kits
 - Sterile water or normal saline
 - Suction set-up
 - Replacement trach kit (same type and size) with obturator, inner cannula and trach ties
 - 10 ml syringe
