TITLE: ROOMING IN

PURPOSE: To outline procedures for Rooming In.

SUPPORTIVE

DATA:

Rooming In Is Recommended:

- 1. To establish a routine for the care of the mother and infant so the mom will more readily adapt to the care of her infant at home.
- 2. To allow the dad the opportunity of holding, feeding and caring for his infant.
- 3. To give both parents confidence in infant care and observation.
- 4. To facilitate education and learning by providing infant care in the presence of parents.
- 5. Facilitates Attachment.
- 6. Reduces the risk of neonatal infection from other patients.

EQUIPMENT: Infant crib with routine care supplies

PROCEDURE:

- 1. Infant is available for rooming in as soon as mother's and infant's conditions are stable.
- 2. Parents may give return demonstration bath ad lib.
- 3. Instruct parent(s) in regard to infant care, feeding, observation and safety.
- 4. Parents may request nursing staff to supervise infant at any time.
- 5. Inform mom that infant may be left in room, but must not be left alone.
- 6. Request mom to instruct visitors in hand washing prior to handling baby.
- 7. Instruct parents to move baby around unit in crib (not to carry in arms).
