## TITLE: LINEN USAGE POLICY - MED/SURG.

Linen changes will occur when needed rather than on a daily basis. An assessment will be performed by the care giver to determine what linen items need to be changed.

- PURPOSE: To insure the proper use of linen items for both patient comfort and safety.
- PROCEDURE: 1. Soiled linen is to be changed immediately. Linens should always be changed at the request of a patient or family member.
  - 2. Basic linen for a bed consists of: one fitted sheet, one flat sheet and one pillow case. Patient gowns and blankets should be provided when needed.
  - 3. A bath towel and wash cloth will be suppled to every patient on a daily basis. Additional ones may be provided if needed.
  - 4. Thermal blankets are to be change only when soiled.
  - 5. All reject clean, torn or stained linen found on the linen cart will be placed in a reject bag designated for that purpose on each unit.
  - 6. An effort should be made to use blankets in the patient s room when they are transported from one department to another via wheelchair or stretcher.
  - 7. To provide increased warmth for the patient, a thermal blanket should be placed **between two flat sheets**. Simply adding more thermal blankets on top of the covers will not provide adequate warmth.
  - 8. A bath blanket should continue to be used when bathing a patient. However, the bath blanket should be retained with the wash basin or placed at the bottom of the bed for daily re-use. Bath blankets should not be routinely used as bottom sheets or as lift sheets.
  - 9. Pillows should be used to position patients instead of thermal blankets. These pillowcases should be changed only when soiled. Storage areas for pillows will be determined by each Head Nurse.
  - 10. Pillows should be cleaned with a disinfectant between patient by the Housekeeping Department.
  - 11. Routine h.s. (at bedtime) care does not include linen change unless soiled.

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- 12. Clean linen should not be taken into the rooms of patients who are anticipating discharge. Also, effort should be made to limit excess linen taken into patient rooms.
- 13. Same day OR admissions should have bed linen straightened rather than changed prior to their return from the operating room.
- 14. Bath blankets, rather than thermal blankets, should be used for warmth for all pre-op patients during transport to the operating room.
- 15. Disposable washcloths will be used for cleaning patients when blood and fecal material are on the body.
- 16. Reusable underpads are to be used for incontinent patients only and are to be changed PRN.
- 17. If patient restraints are required, linen should not be used for this purpose.
- 18. One reusable pillow should be used per bed. Additional pillows should be provided as needed for patient comfort.
- 19. Care should be taken when pulling linen off the linen carts so that clean linen does not fall to the floor.
- 20. Clean linen should not be stored in bed stands or closets. Clean items stored in the room **just in case** are frequently not required and discarded at discharge.
- 21. Precaution gowns and blankets should not be worn as a warm-up.
- 22. If it is necessary to use a bath blanket as a mattress pad, it should be changed only when soiled.
- 23. Any unit specific changes to these linen policies must be approved by the Head Nurse and the Vice President for Nursing.
- 24. Patient robes, pajama bottoms, extra large gowns and impervious gowns are available when needed in the closet above the linen cart.
