TITLE: TRIAGE OF TELEMETRY TRANSMITTERS

access to telemetry transmitters for other patients.

PURPOSE: To outline the procedure to discontinue monitoring of stable telemetry patients when there is limited

SUPPORTIVE

DATA:

1. Triaging can be initiated by a Monitor Tech, Charge Nurse in the units where telemetry is monitored, Administrative Coordinator and/or attending physician/ Critical Care Medical Director.

Triaging is an ongoing process that occurs during shift handoff between nurses and daily discussion with physicians during his/her rounds.

3. Triage will occur in the event when 18 telemetry transmitters are in use on the Medical/Surgical units.

CONTENT: PROCEDURE

- 1. Triage is completed daily by primary nurse during handoff. The nurse discusses the need for patient to be on telemetry.
- 2. During physician daily rounds, telemetry utilization is discussed.
- 3. When 18 telemetry transmitters are in use on the Medical/Surgical units and there are no orders for discontinuation, the Monitor tech working 1900-0730 will provide a list of potential patients eligible for discontinuation to Med-Surg. Every Med-Surg patient monitored for 48 hours or longer, regardless of rhythm, rate, ectopy are to be placed on the list.
- 4. The list is faxed to the unit where the patients are housed.
- 5. Med-surg nursing staff will discuss telemetry renewal or discontinuation with patient's physician.
- Charge nurse or patient's primary nurse will advise telemetry tech of orders received, either for continuation of telemetry or discontinuation.
