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ED (Scope)

TITLE: PEDIATRIC TEACHING PROTOCOL

PURPOSE: To outline the discharge teaching areas for both Pediatric and Adult patients and their respective parents and/or caregivers (as necessary).

POLICY:

Discharge of an emergency department patient involves teaching the patient and the parent/caregiver (as needed) regarding Home Care Instructions. Information given to the patient/caregiver should describe activity or diet restrictions, specific homecare needs (i.e. wound care), physician follow-up, parameters which indicate the patient's condition is worsening and any recommended interventions. Additionally, instructions on any newly prescribed medication which should include dose, frequency, side effects and potential drug/food interactions.

PROCEDURE:

- 1. Obtain written discharge order from Emergency Department physician or attending physician.
- Select appropriate discharge instructions and follow up in Exit-Rider based on physician order.
- 3. Print two identical copies of discharge instructions, review for accuracy. Staff nurse who is giving discharge instructions should sign both copies.
- 4. Present discharge instructions to patient and or care giver. Provide verbal instructions based on learner's developmental level that explain written instructions.
- 5. Provide patient and or care-giver the opportunity to ask questions.
- 6. Ensure patient and or care-giver understands discharge instructions through verbalization of information previously discussed.
- 7. Have patient and or care-giver sign copy of discharge instructions that is to remain with the patient chart.
- 8. Ensure patient leaves with a copy of their discharge instructions and all prescriptions.
