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PROCEDURE

TITLE: PHYSICAL EXAM, ASSISTING THE PHYSICIAN WITH

PURPOSE: To assist the physician in diagnostic evaluation and to provide as much privacy and

comfort for the patient as possible.

SUPPORTIVE DATA: This may be done at the bedside or in an examination room.

EQUIPMENT LIST: 1. Sheet 8. Otoscope 9. Opthalmoscope 2. Sphygmomanometer

> 3. Stethoscope 10. Vaginal specula with slider and fixative, if needed

4. Flashlight 11. Lamp, if needed 12. Non-sterile gloves

5. Tongue Depressor 6. Applicator

7. Percussion Hammer

CONTENT **PROCEDURE STEPS**

1. Have the patient void.

- 2. Place the patient on the exam table or bed.
- 3. Remove the clothing and place the sheet over the patient with a towel over the chest.
- 4. Assist the patient into the desired position for examination.
- 5. Drape each area being examined.
- 6. Assist the physician as necessary.
- 7. Return the patient to the room.
- 8. Label the specimen(s), if any, and send to the laboratory.
- 9. Rinse contaminated equipment with water. Place the clean equipment in a ziplock bag and place it in the dirty utility room to be taken to Central Supply for appropriate cleaning.
- 10. Return the equipment to the proper place.
- 11. Leave the room neat.

Notify Environmental Service to clean exam room.

KEY POINTS

Explain what is being done.

If the exam is done at the bedside, fan fold covers to the foot of the bed. Avoid the unnecessary exposure of any part of the body.

Remain with the female patient during the exam. Flexion of knees helps to relax abdominal muscles. Expose the patient only when necessary.

Have ready the type of specimen collection means and type of equipment for exam.
