## **PROCEDURE**

TITLE: HIV ANTIBODY TESTING CONSENT

PURPOSE: To outline information needed to obtain HIV Antibody Testing

SUPPORTIVE DATA: The Centers for Disease Control, Atlanta, Georgia, recommends the testing of individuals be performed on agreement--between the individual and the physician providing care. It is also recommended that

counseling be done before and after any HIV test. A signed consent for HIV is required.

Lab work will be performed only after signed informed consent has been obtained.

CONTENT: PROCEDURE: KEY POINTS:

1. Verify physician order and that physician has counseled patient.

HIV testing may not be ordered over the telephone.

2. Review the consent with patient and have patient mark consent/refusal of test and sign the form.

- 3. Nurse obtaining consent will sign as a witness.
- 4. Place the signed consent in the patient's chart.
- 5. Forward completed lab slip to the Laboratory.
- 6. The blood specimen will be obtained by the Laboratory after reviewing consent form.
- The results of HIV testing will be placed directly on the patient's medical record and a copy forwarded to the physician by the Laboratory.
