## C. Post-Procedure Care:

- 1. Gently clean the skin and apply topical antibiotic ointment around the insertion site if indicated by physician.
- 2. Provide nursing unit or caregiver with following instructions regarding tube care and potential problems: a. Daily site cleansing with mild soap and water is usually all that is required.
  - b. During the daily cleaning, rotate the tube in the stoma to promote independence.
  - c. Open the safety plug at the top of the button to attach the appropriate feeding tube with the bolus or continuous adapter to the button.
  - d. Flush the tube with warm H20 before and after every use with 5-10cc for children and 5 cc and 5-10 cc for adults. During continuous feeding, flush approximately every four hours.
