1. Only use supplies that have been identified as being latex-free.

2. Avoid dispensing medications that are in vials containing latex stoppers. Instead, use medications that are in glass ampules. If a medication is not available in a glass ampule, draw the medication directly from an opened multidose vial after removing the stopper. Administer medication as soon as possible.

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## C. POST-OPERATIVELY

- 1. Transport patient to PACU with the Central Supply latex allergy box.
- 2. Report patient's latex allergy to the PACU staff.
