POLICY

A sensory evaluation would be necessary to determine extent of neurological involvement. A formal evaluation is completed when definitive data is necessary.

PROCEDURE

- 1. Purpose is to be explained to the patient.
- 2. Tools for sensory evaluation (pins, cotton, vibratory hammer, brush, monofilaments) should be clean and pre-gathered for testing.
- 3. Patient should be relaxed. Area to be tested must be exposed, draping appropriate for rest of body.
- 4. Test both sides of the body, uninvolved side first.
- 5. Give patient a few preliminary trials of each testing to prepare them.
- 6. Be sure to observe patient's facial expression--eyes closed when necessary.
- 7. Ask clear questions to be sure the responses are clear and concise.
- 8. Record findings in evaluation and progress notes.
